


#### **Dorridge Primary School Values**


#### **Early Years Provision Outstanding**

#### Extended provision:


ND: Full time, M-F 5 full days a week

Breakfast session All year groups 7:45 am to 8:50 am


Lunch wraparound Nursery only

### Benefits of a School Based Nursery

- Ease of transition to Reception
- Familiarity with school setting and staff
- Qualified teacher plans, teaches and assesses.
- Establish and continuing friendships through EYFS and main school
- Flexible wrap around care from 7:45 6:00pm each day and holiday provision with school staff
- At Dorridge, we currently offer morning Nursery places ONLY.
- 30 Hour funding for 3 and 4 years olds (if eligible)
- At Dorridge, there is access and opportunities to whole school facilities including Forest School, large outside areas in school grounds, gardens, running track, resources, IT equipment, large play areas.
- Being part of the whole school community including special assemblies, visitors, events (benefits for children and parents)
- Parents will receive a half termly email observation of their child in nursery, so you can keep tabs of what they've been up to.

# What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

- The Early Years Foundation Stage (E.Y.F.S.) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year
- All schools and Ofsted-registered early years providers must follow the EYFS, including childminders, preschools, nurseries and school reception classes
- It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.
